

Success at Yorkshire Swimming Champs confirms Scarborough Swimming Club as Town's Top Club

Scarborough Swimming Club has once again out-performed rival local clubs at the prestigious Yorkshire Short Course Swimming Championships.

24 swimmers between the ages of 9 and 18 earned qualifying times in a record 72 swims.

Personal best times were achieved by all swimmers with 2 medal wins from 14 year old Alex Lynn and finalists caps won by 11 year old Joe Kelly, 12 year old Amy Corcoran and 12 year old Nathan Munday.

8 swimmers won North Eastern Qualifying times at the weekend's gala and will go on to represent the town against top Northern East clubs in Sunderland in December.

National swimmers Alex Lynn (14), and Jace Cappleman (16) will be joined by team-mates Chris Cook (15), Eleanor Woodroffe (16), Lizzie Swift(14), Amy Corcoran (12), Joe Kelly (11), Nathan Munday (12) and twins Adam and Phoebe Dawson (12) at the top regional event.

Head Coach Sam Greetham, currently representing British Swimming in China, said "Our swimmers' success at the Yorkshire Championships confirms Scarborough Swimming Club as the top competitive club in the area.

Swimmers from Filey, Bridlington, Pickering, Whitby and Helmsley travel to us for up to 16 hours a week of training so that they can reach these heights.

They fought hard to stay at the top of the Ridings Premier League this year and will be taking the trophy home for the 4th consecutive year and now they can focus on achieving success at the Regional Champs.
